Opened: To excavate area sealed by cobbled floor section of F18030

Limits (N) debris below W9282

- (S) L18044
- (E) L18044
- (W) W9957

Closed: floor was removed and came down on reddish brown soil. Season ended. Came down to about the same level as Kurkar floor patches of F18044 though no floor was found in L18043

Matrix: The matrix of L18043 was that of cobble stones and a thin plaster deposit. A large amount of bone and pottery were excavated. The fill beneath the cobble stones contained the majority of the pottery and bone. L18043 was excavated until the fill beneath became the same as that from L18044. Cobbles were fist size to 15cm in diameter

Relations: L18043 is sealed by cobbles floor section of F18030. L18043 is floor makeup of F18030 and fill below

- To the North L18043 continues into the debris below W9282 and W9560
- To the South L18043' cobbles do not continue into L18044; the reason for this is uncertain: the debris below *
- To the East L18043' cobbles do not continue into L18044; the reason for this is uncertain. The debris below @
- To the West L18043 probably is cut by W9957
- L18043 covers, but does not seal an unnumbered locus below.
- F18043 reaches W9957 in the west. F18043 reaches to the debris below W9282 in the north. F18043 continues to L18044 in the east. F18043 continues to L9973 in the south.

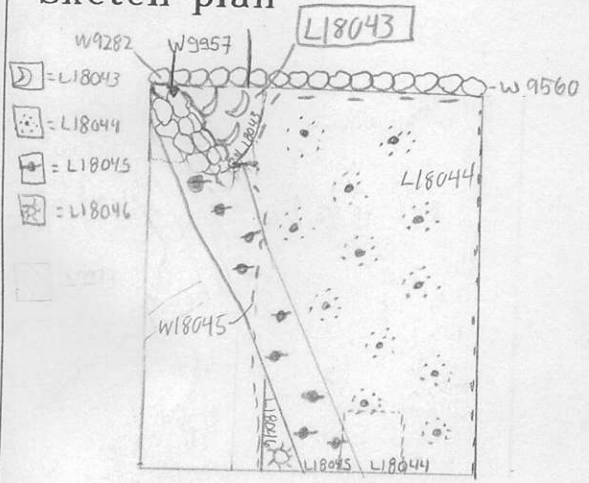
F18043 is the only cobblestone floor in evidence in AG33 at this elevation. L9973 directly south shows no cobblestone floor or any other type of floor material which would correspond. L18044 began to show a Kurkar floor at the same elevation directly south from F18043. The profile of the debris below W9282 shows a Kurkar depositional line at this elevation to the Eastern bank of L18044.

* the cobbles of 18043 continues into L18044. All refs to F18043 should be understood as F18030 = F9962!!
 @ the cobbles of 18043 continues into L18044

Additional Observations/Value: The value is high as it is the only excavated cobblestone floor in evidence in AG33.
