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Summary \_\_\_\_\_

Opened: To uncover the mudbrick wall which was seen in a mini N-S section extending along a line about 1.5m into the square. The degraded top of the wall was visible in section. Also the N part of the wall was traced.

Limits (N) W9957 and L18043 and debris below W9282

(S) The debris below W9278

(E) L18044

(W) L18046, L9986

Closed: End of season, not closed.

Matrix: The soil of W18045 on top of the mudbrick wall was medium brown with a high concentration of pottery. Less bone was in evidence than in the loci above and to the west. The mudbrick wall was found 8-10cm from the high elevation of W18045. There are several Kurkar tracer bricks and a few fugate lines were observed but could not be traced very well.

Relations: Above - covered but not sealed by L9986. Covered and probably cut by W9957.

To the North W18045 is reached by W9957 and L18043. Covered by W9957 and reached by L18043

To the East W18045 is reached by L18044. Kurkar floor patches of L18044 may reach W18045

To the South W18045 is reached by debris below W9278. Continues into the debris below W9278

To the West W18045 is reached by W18076 on the north and is probably reached by L9986 which is the same as L18076 (which is better preserved in the west bank of AG.33). W18045 is also reached by L9986's W section as both L9986 + W18045 were initially excavated as one locus and the bricks of 18045 were not clear until the end of the season of 93.

Directly beneath W9957 in a S.S.E direction at precisely the same angle W18045 is in a friable condition directly south of W9957 and becomes more intact as it continues southward. Fugate lines were clearly distinguished in the southern section.

In the E profile of W18045 from the slightly deeper L18044 Kurkar bricks can be seen to be directly beneath the 1.4.16 elevation.

Note that W18045 is the East wall of the area of Cheryl's Famous Floor. W18045 with W9985 may mark a doorway into Cheryl's floor.

Additional Observations/Value: This locus holds a high value as it clearly shows the extension of W9957 southward.
