Opened: When fallen stone in SW corner of L9985 was recognized as a separate depositional unit and retroactively assigned a locus #.

Limits (N) Bounded by L9985 to the North.

(S) Bounded by W9211 to the South.

(E) Bounded by L9985 to the East.

(W) Bounded by L9974 and W9408 to the West.

Closed: Not closed. End of season.

Matrix: Fieldstones 20-30 cm in diameter in brown mudbrick material with restoration pottery around and below stones with some bone present.

Relations: L18059 appears to be covered by L9974, the mudbrick bench, in its SW corner. Pottery belonging to the "cult" assemblage was found on the stones of L18059 (formerly of L9985) within the matrix of L9903; <sup>therefore</sup> L9903 also covers but does not seal, the area of L18059 not covered by by L9974. L18059 reaches W9211 to the South and W9408 to the West. To the East, L18059 would appear to cut the material of L9985 and L18054 below, given that similar pottery from the same restoration group is found in both loci & below the stones of L18059, unless they are all of the same depositional unit.

Additional Observations/Value: Fallen stone reaching Phase 8 walls covered by ignominious mudbrick bench yielding wavy banded pithoi sherds Really high Value.
