Opened: START OF THE SEASON. CONTINUATION OF L18360

Limits (N) L18368 / L18378
 (S) BALK
 (E) L18385

Closed: THE REDDISH MATERIAL DISAPPEARED AND WE CHANGED LOCs. The material below [L18386] and [L18385] was identical so they were closed and one new locus (L18389) opened in their place.

Matrix: RED BROWN SOIL, DISTINCTIVE FROM THE GREY AND BROWN FILLS OF L18395 AND L18385, DOWN TO GREY-BLUE FILL. IN THE SW CORNER RUBBLE APPEARED IN THE BALK NEXT TO W18332 (HALF FIST-SIZE STONES ABOUT 40 CM HIGH). SINCE NO LINING OF A PIT WAS DISCOVERED, IT IS NOT CERTAIN IF [L18386] WAS A PIT OR NOT

Relations: ABOVE: L18360 covers but does not seal [L18386] and may continue down as [L18386]
NORTH: [L18386] may cut THE FILLS OF L18368 AND L18378 if [L18386] is truly a pit, if [L18386] *
SOUTH: [L18386] CONTINUES IN THE BALK
EAST: THE FILL OF [L18386] REACHES L18385 BUT NO CLEAR BORDER WAS VISIBLE
WEST: [L18386] CONTINUES IN THE TEMPORARY BALK AND IN THE BALK UNDER W18332. HOWEVER, THE RUBBLE IN THE SW CORNER IN THE BALK COULD EVENTUALLY HAVE FORMED PART OF W18332 AND IT OBSTRUCTS A CLEAR VIEW. **
BELOW: [L18386] AND L18385 cover, but do not seal L18389.

* is not a pit, the relationship to L18368 and L18378 is not clear.
 ** Based on excavation W. of W18332, W18332 is likely only a foundation at the level of [L18386]. Possibly L18386 is either a pit back-filled with rubble and mudbrick debris which W18332 cuts, or simply wall collapse from a wall still hidden in the S. balk which is similarly cut by W18332.

Additional Observations/Value: LOW VALUE, uncertain what this material is.
