Matrix: Facing stones 10-20cm to S with cobble core (?)

Relations: 2 rows of stones protrude from the baulk under wall W9400, large facing stones and a row of cobbles, perhaps a cobble core. This wall functioned in installation F18470 consisting of narrow units (none fully exposed or preserved) with a thick floor bedding of shells. The perpendicular wall W18471 (N-S) is also part of the installation.

- Pit L18492 cut into this wall.

- Upon removing the stones of the single course, shells were found under the westernmost stone only. The stones were bedded at the same elevation as the bottom course of the perpendicular wall W1840. Based on pottery readings the comparable levels are coincidental.

- No sealed locus distinguished below due to the limited extent of this stretch of wall.

Importance: High value - The only phase 11 construction, unfortunately of indeterminate function.

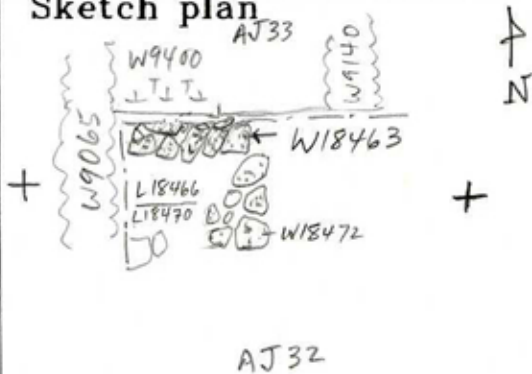
