**Opened:** Continuation of multiple surface accumulations below fl 18444. L18444 above was cleared down to an easily traceable plaster surface.

**Limits (N)** Baulk

(S) Baulk

(E) Baulk

(W) Baulk

**Closed:** Came down onto surface fl 18491 with crucible / tabun bottom, extensive burning and large bones and sherds.

**Matrix:** Accumulated layers of sandy brown soil, grey ashy soil, sand lenses, plaster/ash layers and one very thick carbonized layer.

**Relations:** The easily traceable carbonized layer sloped down dramatically to the SW and stopped on a line parallel to the baulk! The slope suggests the carbonized deposits was dumped, but the straight edge supports the interpretation of a combustible material burned in situ. The carbonized layer was bordered to the S by a clean, brown, sandy deposit (= L18483 south of the baulk) = L18511 to the N with tabun (?) fragments scattered on the surface.

- Three photos (192623-5) were taken of this locus.

**Importance:** High value - for understanding the nature of the multiple surface accumulations in Area G. LB pottery.


