towards the end of the season it looked as if we reached the bottom of the pit (much less pottery and soil started to become more compact), and after cleaning, it looks as if the bottom of this pit is also an earlier floor F18580 which the pit did not cut.

Additional Observations/Value: **This is the continuation (= the bottom of) the Persian pit**

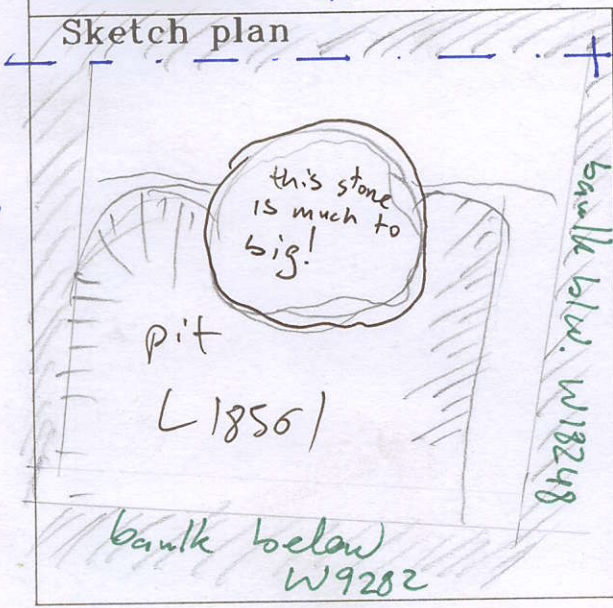
