Matrix: Soft grey brown soil (same soil as in L18554, above) with plenty of small tiny stones.

Relations: L18564 is partly sealed (separations were made when pottery was collected) by F18554.

L18564 is adjacent to L18565 and to W18575 at west.

It is obviously earlier than the MB walls (9989 at S. and 9735 at N) because now W9989 clearly floats.

Digging L18564 we reached a round installation at the southern part of the locus (see sketch) This installation was filled with stones. In the northern part of L18564 we discovered a (another) plaster floor that slopes steeply southwards.

It was later discovered that, this floor is a part of F18565 to the west

Between the Northern side of L18564 and its southern side there is some unclear feature (Fill? trench?) of MB that seems to cut these floors and fills (see sect.)

Additional Observations/Value: fill down to floor in the courtyard of the IA building
