OPENED: Technical opening when top of drain L9054 was reached. Locus L9050 split into Loci 9054, 9055 & 9056.

DEFINITION: To north by L9054, to east by bank, to south by material under loci L9053, w.9058, w.9047; to south-west by material under floor 9044; to west by ^{unexcavated material under} wall 9051.

CLOSED: When drain L9054 was removed, Loci 19054, 19055 and L9056 were collapsed into L9063.

RELATION: Cut by drain L9054, reaches east bank, reaches material under Loci L9053, w.9058, w.9047, floor L9044 and w.9051. Mud brick material

found under wall w.9051 and northern portion of floor 9044.

w.9051, Fl. 9044, w.9047, w.9058, L9053 Floor above L9056

Would have ended either on that floor noticed in western section level with bottom of drain [9054] but either that floor was taken out or did not extend into locus (removed in antiquity?). In southeastern section came down on sloping field stones directly to the north and below w.9058.
