

REASON FOR OPENING A DISTINCT SOIL CHANGE INDICATED THE PRESENCE OF PIT L9100 TO THE SOUTH AND EAST OF THE AREA EAST OF DRAIN L9025.

DEFINITION/LIMITS THIS IS AN AREA OF FILL, WHICH EXTENDS FROM THE EASTERN WALL OF DRAIN L9025 TO THE EASTERN BULK IN THE NORTH, AND TO THE EDGE OF PIT L9100 IN THE SOUTH. IT EXTENDS FROM THE SOUTHERN WALL OF DRAIN L9109 TO THE SOUTHERN BULK.

MATRIX RICH BROWN CLAY, COMPACTED WITH RUBBLE, TURNED ALMOST WHITE BY THE PRESENCE OF MANY FRAGMENTS OF CEMENT AND PLASTER. THIS WHITISH COLOUR GRADUALLY DECLINED UNTIL ONLY THE SOIL DIRECTLY BESIDE THE TWO DRAINS SHOWED THE PRESENCE OF

THIS MATERIAL.

REASON FOR CLOSING WE REACHED THE BOTTOM OF PIT L9100 AND SIMULTANEOUSLY CAME DOWN UPON W9051 BELOW DRAIN L9025

RELATION TO OTHER ELEMENTS IT IS CUT BY THE EAST WALL OF DRAIN L9025 AND THE SOUTH WALL OF DRAIN L9109. IT IS CUT BY PIT L9100. IT LIES BELOW L9092, WHICH CONSISTS OF SIMILAR (OR IDENTICAL) MATERIAL, AND IS ABOVE L9130 WHICH IS IDENTICAL SOIL, BUT WITHOUT THE CEMENT AND PLASTER. IN THE SOUTH EAST CORNER OF THE SQUARE, L9095 LIES ABOVE

NB: THIS LOCUS, AND L9100, PROBABLY TOGETHER MADE UP L9099 IN AI31.

						A SMALL FRAGMENT OF KUKAR FLOOR — SO THIS FLOOR BECAME FLOOR [L9099]. HOWEVER, THIS FLOOR IS BADLY DISTORTED, AND SLOPES RADICALLY BENEATH THE LEVEL OF PIT [L5100] WHICH APPEARS TO HAVE CUT THE FLOOR [L9099]. IN FACT WE ONLY DISCOVERED THE NORTHEASTMOST EXTENSION OF FLOOR [L9099] ON THE EASTERN BULK BELOW THE OPENING LEVELS OF [L9130]. SINCE THE MATERIAL ABOVE THIS FLOOR MUST BE [L5099] ^{IT APPEARS THAT} WE CLOSED [L9099] SLIGHTLY TOO EARLY AT THIS POINT OF THE SQUARE. (— SOME 11 CMS. TOO EARLY) THIS FLOOR CAN BE SEEN IN THE NORTH BULK OF AI31, BUT WAS APPARENTLY ONLY NOTED IN THE BULK THERE ^{TOO} . ABOUT 13 CMS. BELOW THIS KUKAR FLOOR WE DISCOVERED ANOTHER ONE — ONLY JUST VISIBLE IN THE BULKS. THIS IS SURELY AN EARLIER VERSION OF THE SAME FLOOR — SO WE IDENTIFIED IT AS FLOOR 9099B (THE FLOOR ABOVE BECOMING FLOOR L9099A). THE LEVELS WERE, HIGHEST PT. SOUTH BULK, 15,37; LOWEST POINT, EAST BULK, 15,24. [L9099] LIES ABOVE [L9051].
