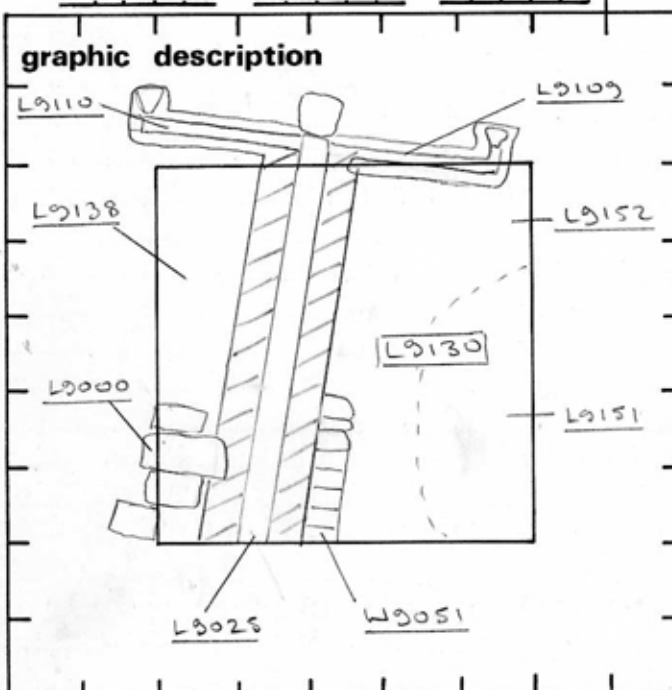

Description:

REASON FOR OPENING: WE REACHED THE BOTTOM OF PIT 19100 AND SIMULTANEOUSLY CAME DOWN UPON THE TOP OF HEADER WALL 19051.

DEFINITION/LIMITS. IT EXTENDS FROM THE EAST BALK. TO THE MATERIAL DIRECTLY BELOW DRAIN 19025 AND REACHED WALL 19051. IT EXTENDS FROM THE SOUTH BALK TO THE MATERIAL BELOW DRAIN 19109 in the north.

MATRIX BROWNISH, SANDY MATERIAL, ON THE EASTERN SIDE, MORE CLAY TOWARDS THE WEST. MUCH ASH BELOW THE KURKAN FLOORS 19099A AND 19099B, WHICH EVENTUALLY BECAME

DISTINGUISHABLE AS PIT 19151.

REASON FOR CLOSING WE IDENTIFIED THE GREY, SANDY AREA TO THE EAST AS A PIT, SO DIVIDED 19130 INTO TWO NEW LOCI, PIT 19151 AND 19152.

RELATION TO OTHER ELEMENTS IF 19051 IS A FOUNDATION COURSE THEN IT CUT 19130. THE MATERIAL BELOW DRAINS 19025 AND 19109 IS PROBABLY IDENTICAL WITH THAT OF 19130. CLAY FILL 19099 LIES

								Note: It may be that 9130 is a false locus, in the sense that pit [L9100]	
								may not come to an end where stated, but we may instead have different	
								material tossed into the pit at an earlier date (= [L9157]) than [L9100].	
								The eastern part of [L9130], which was somewhat different than the	
								material in its western half, may be a ca. 20 cm spit of debris	
								between [L9151] and [L9100] in the same pit. Likewise, [L9163] may be a	
								false locus; [L9207] may be the earliest part of a very large pit. The latest	
								pit pottery seems to be 03, see [L9151]; the latest material bordering the pits is	
								possibly 03, or 04.
