

Summary:

Description: [OPENING] L9154 was opened when L9087 and L9120 were collapsed when soil became same red-brown clay, and pottery frequency increased.

DEF/L1M/L9154 is a stratified accumulation coming down on a beaten earth floor. It is limited by W9140 on the east, by L9059, L9166 and L9190 on the south. At the southern end of L9154 15cm was joined to L9190 to prevent possible contamination from L9185 an ash pit, which was the original southern boundary of L9154. L9154 is limited by L9178 and L9168 in the north. It is limited by L9143, L9142, L9141 and L9178, L9173 below, in the east. Floor 9154 lies below L9178, L9173, L9190 north, and is limited by the west baulk, and W9065 in the west, L9139 and L9203 south mudbrick material + L9185 in the south. It is limited

by L9168 and W9066 in the north. It is limited in the east by W9140.

[CLOSED] L9154 was closed when F9154 was reached. One section of F9154 along W9140 was excavated.

RELATIONS The soil of L9154 reached L9143 and L9141. It was partially cut by L9142 on an ash pit. The soil also reached and was identical to L9178 and L9173. L9154 was cut by L9168 and the pit material of L9042 and L9043 above.

	Description: Relations Cont. The soil of [L9154] reaches [W9140]. The soil of [L9154] is cut by [L9059] and was originally cut by [L9185] before the annexation by [L9190] of the SOUTHERN 15cm. [F9154] is cut by parts [L9185] and [L9168] and [L9139]. [F9154] extends below [L9173], [L9178] and [L9154] and the northern part of [L9190]. The floor reaches [W9140]. The Floor reaches [W9065] and continues on the west side of [W9065] against the baulk. [F9154] may extend under [W9065]. [F9154] reaches [L9203] which may be the remains of a wall.	OVER →

AT opening the area was covered with a thin light grey soft ash lens, but it could not be traced. A taboon cut the F9154 and continued below. A shattered by <i>in situ</i> pot, was first uncovered in a bedding of shells. Shells were also found within the pot and the bottom. An intact cup and saucer and sherds from other vessels were also found within the vessel. A complete juglet was found embedded in the opening level ash lens.</p> <p>[F9154] is a sloping surface of beaten earth covered with a thin layer of dark grey ash. It slopes from down from E to W. 						8/02 EB-S L9154 was excavated with the bottom 13.81-.82m. F9154 was then removed down to 13.95-13.69 (card #2). The problem is that by digging down the extra .10m the stratigraphic relationships changed! L9154 with L9173 met W9066, but F9154 only extended as far as W9400. Therefore, L9154 becomes 9154A and F9154 = L9154B.
