Summary:

Description: OPENED: CAME DOWN UPON AREA OF DENSE RUBBLE.

DEFINITION/LIMITS: NORTH AND EAST BORDERED BY BAWLKS. TO THE WEST LIES L9174 AND TO THE SOUTH L9176.

MATRIX: LARGE (AVERAGE AROUND 30 BY 20cm) ROCKS, DENSELY PACKED BUT ALMOST ALL RESTING AT ANGLES IN LIGHT BROWN EARTH SO NOT A WALL.

REASON FOR CLOSING: END OF SEASON, not closed.

RELATION TO OTHER ELEMENTS: SOIL AROUND RUBBLE OF L9175 EXACTLY LIKE L9176 TO THE SOUTH, AND THE LIGHT BROWN EARTH IN THE EASTERN AREA OF L9176 (DIRECTLY ABOVE L9175). L9175 LOOKS AS IF IT CUTS L9174 WHICH CONSISTS OF GREYISH BROWN MATERIAL. ONLY DUG AROUND RUBBLE, NOT INTO IT. Along with L9176 and L9177 L9175 is probably part of a Rubber Trench.
