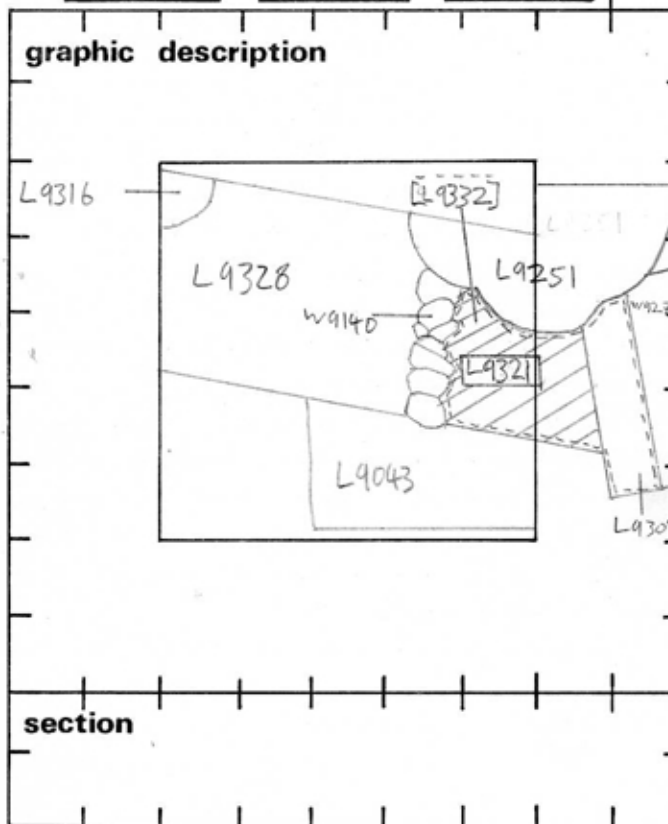

Summary:			
Description: <u>Opened</u> : When <u>W9140</u> was discovered and <u>L9302</u> was split into <u>L9328</u> and <u>L9321</u> .			
Definition/Limits: <u>Founded</u> on the west by <u>W9140</u> on the North by <u>L9251</u> on the east by <u>L9308</u> and on the south by <u>L9043</u> .			
Matrix: <u>Mud brick material and some pottery sherds</u>			
Relationship to Other Elements: <u>L9321</u> reaches <u>W9140</u> , is cut by <u>L9251</u> and is of the same matrix as <u>L9308</u> , but is at a higher level and is thus divided by a technical boundary. <u>L9043</u> Probably cuts <u>L9321</u> but <u>L9043</u> was excavated two years ago and this relationship is hard to determine.

L9321 covers most of L9332 AND IS COVERED BY THE EASTERN HALF OF L9302.

REASON FOR CLOSING: L9321 WAS COLLAPSED WITH L9308 TO FORM L9332 WHEN L9321 WAS EXCAVATED DOWN TO THE LEVEL OF L9308 AND IT WAS DETERMINED THAT THEY WERE OF THE SAME MATERIAL.
