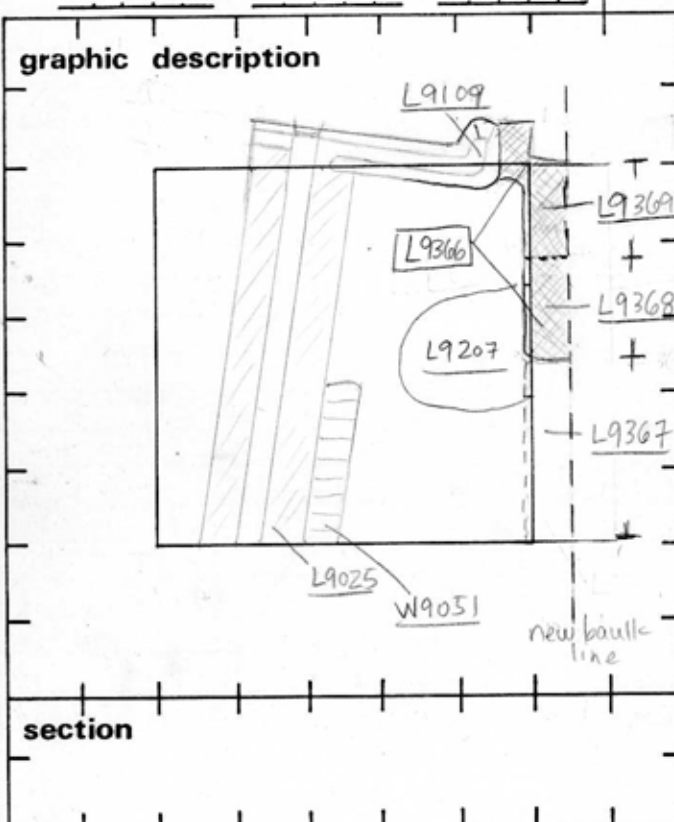

**Summary:**

**Description:**

**Reason For Opening:** In cutting back baulk 0.5 m of square AI 32 we identified a rocky/rubble area at NE corner along the Eastern baulk; this area designated [L9366]

**Def. & Limits:** Bounded on N and E by baulks, on S by floor of [L9367], on W by Square AI 32

**Reason Closed:** Came down upon stone pavement at NE corner of baulk [L9369]; it also became <sup>clear that</sup> the area to the immediate south along Eastern baulk is a floor (of a phantom locus) [L9367]

**Matrix:** Grey, sandy soil, full of bits of plaster, very little pottery or bone

At NE corner lots of rubble & field stones becoming less dense towards end of locus: [L9366] ca. 2.54 m in length, ca. 54 m in width

**Relations:** The Eastern baulk of AI 32 completely covered [L9366]. [L9366] covers pavement [L9369] and the continuation of the robber trench [L9368]. [L9366] lies adjacent to floor of [L9367] but I don't yet know their relationship. When AI 32 was last excavated (1987), excavator found an area
