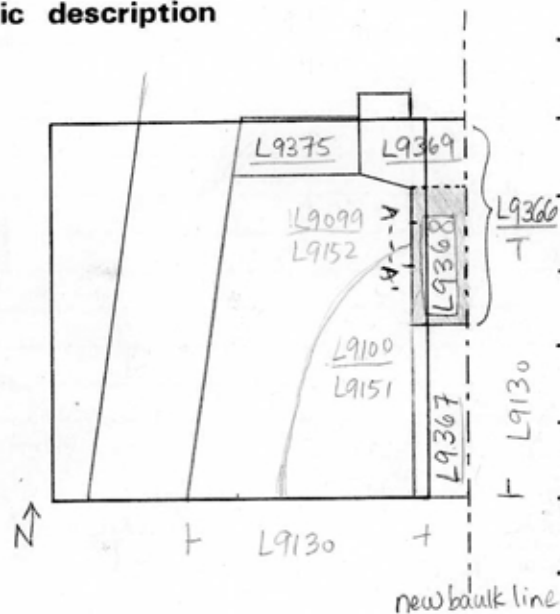

Summary:

Description:

Open: In taking down [L9366] came down upon 2 distinct areas, cobble stone pavement ([L9369]) & area of dark grey-brown soil & tumble of cobble stones ([L9368]).

Def. & Limits: To N, bounded by [L9369] To E, bounded by bank, To S, bounded by floor [L9367] and bank above. To W, bordered by [L9099] & [L9100] and material below each.

Matrix / 2 Components: ① Headsize & fistsize cobble stones, clay-like light brown earth in area just south of [L9369], ca. 7.5 m in length N-S, ca. 0.4 m in width E-W (Robber Trench).
 ② Appears to be cut by a pit, consisting of darker greyish-brown, sandy earth, very few sherds, but numerous shells.

Closing: End of Season - Not fully excavated
 Not Closed

Relations: To S, may cut floor [L9367] To N, probably, cuts [L9369]. Lies below [L9366]. Relationship between [L9368] and [L9099] is unclear, but likely that [L9368] cut [L9099]. Material of pit [L9100] may be identical to pit →

Summary: Material of L9368 definitely disturbed.
