

**Description:** [Opened]: When L9376 came down on stones of W9420.

[Def/Lim]: North, East and South By section-cleaning Locus L9422, west By L9411 and above, and W9140.

[Matrix]: Field stones and 2 cut stones. Ranging from fist size to 50x10x30 cm.

[Closed]: When Bottom of Wall Reached and wall Was Removed.

[Relations]: Sump Wall Actually consists of W9420, W9090, part of W9140 and possibly Rubble of L9098. It is Reached BY L9421, L9083, L9122 and L9379 which Make up the Fill within the Sump. Material surrounding the Sump on the North, East and South was excavated as a Single Locus L9422 which is cut By

By W9420. It seems probable that W9140 is cut By W9420, and the cut was then filled by a narrow portion used exclusively as the sump wall.
