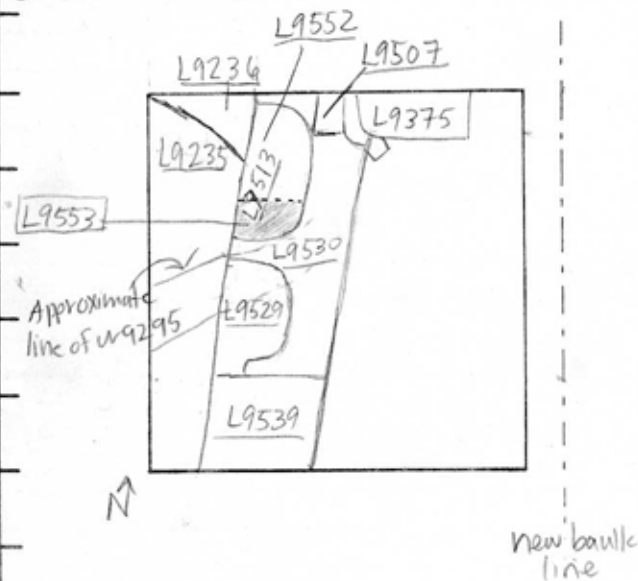

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Summary:

Description:

Opening: In excavating pit [L9513] came down upon mudbrick debris at S end, so decided to split pit into two new loci [L9553] & [L9552].
 = mudbrick debris = continuation of pit

Def & Limits: To N, bounded by [L9552]. To E & S, bounded by [L9530]. To W, bounded by [L9235].

Matrix 1: Hard-packed, dark brown mudbrick debris / material, mixed with bits of charcoal, leuker debris and pottery; debris from mudbrick wall [W9295]

Closing: Mudbrick debris leveled down to similar mudbrick material at bottom of pit L9552 & when S face of debris had been cut back to N face of mudbrick wall W9295

Relations: To E & S, possibly ^{reaches} [L9530] ^{but this uncertain}
 To W, probably cuts [L9235].

1. Pit [L9552] cuts the mudbrick debris of [L9553] which may have extended beyond the N limit of the square. The same mudbrick debris is at the bottom of pit [L9552] and seems to reach the N limit of the square. [L9553] is collapse from wall [W9295], uncovered 1953, mainly to W. of present area.
