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Summary

Opened: When the top north course of W9636 was reached while excavating L9621 and L9627; the area north of W9636 became L9635

Limits (N) L9056 (1986 card)  
 (S) W9636  
 (E) L9606 (1991 cleaning locus, L9056 (1986 Locus card)  
 (W) Material below drain L9025.

Closed: When a fragmentary crushed Kurkar floor was exposed.

Matrix: The soil was red-brown mudbrick debris with carbon flecks above a crushed Kurkar floor. To the south of the wall in L9654 a similar sialal occurred 10cm higher (= F9627)

Relations: The fill of L9635 reaches the upper north course of W9636, fragmentary parts of the floor <sup>may be</sup> covered by the upper north course of stones. The fill and floor of L9635 continues into the balk below the drain L9025 and they are covered by L9025. L9056 <sup>probably</sup> cuts L9635. The stones of the north upper course of W9636 are set into the rest of the wall at a level lower than the top stones of the courses to the south, which are covered by F9627. F9635 reaches W9636 at the point where the north upper course of W9636 is set into the rest of the wall. See section. It is likely that F9636 and F9627 which reaches the <sup>top of the</sup> north upper course of W9636 south of the upper course, are contemporary, though they do not reach each other. They are both crushed Kurkar floors and reach W9636's north upper course. Either the north upper course of W9636 is a late reuse of an earlier wall or the main part of W9636 is a 'sleeper' construction and the floors are contemporary with the wall. i.e. most of W9636 was below floor level (F9627 & F9635) and the north upper course of W9636 functioned as a step. The two ashlar stretchers in W9636 may then have been the base of a column. W9058 floats above the level of 9635 and does not seal it because it is later. L9635 is covered by 9621 and 9627. The area of 9627 was sealed by L9052. (W9058 = L9052, L9053, L9058, L9068) - L962 and L9627 thus seal L9635. 9635 covers, but does not seal 9653 because 9635's floor is too fragmentary.

Additional Observations/Value: A sealed locus.

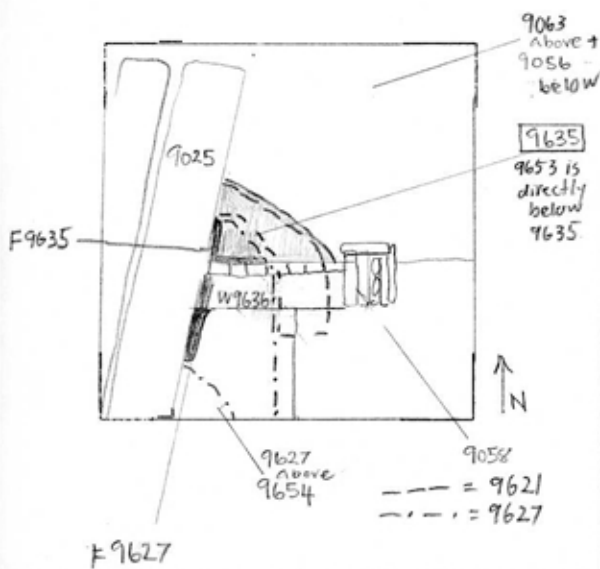

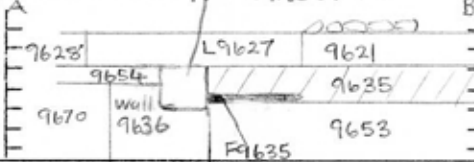
