Summary

Opened: When a soil change in the western portion of L 9645 was noted from brown semi-sandy soil to a more greyish, slightly ashen, more cohesive matrix, called L 9663.

Limits (N) Bounded on the North by unexcavated material beneath W 9015.

(S) Bounded on the South by unexcavated material beneath W 9147 and by L 9669.

(E) Bounded on the East by L 9662.

(W) Bounded on the West by unexcavated material below the unexcavated part of L 9679.

Closed: When greyish matrix of possible pit was removed to reveal fallen mudbrick material of L 9679.

Matrix: Grey to brown slightly ashen soil with some pottery and bone, few stones, and some small plaster and karkar chunks.

Relations: L 9663 is covered by L 9645. If L 9645 is the continuation of robber trench L 9511, then L 9645 probably cuts L 9663. If L 9645 is fallen material (mudbrick?), then L 9663 cuts L 9645, but this relationship was not noticed until excavated to the level at which the soil change (see above) was discerned. L 9663 probably cuts the portion of L 9679 that it covers if it is actually a pit. If L 9663 is not a pit, then it merely covers L 9679. L 9663 cuts L 9662 and is probably the continuation of the pit material of L 9669. If L 9663 is not a pit, then it is cut by L 9669. L 9663 extends beneath W 9147 and the unexcavated portion of L 9511, but does appear to extend beneath W 9015. This indicates that if L 9663 actually is a pit, then its northern edge is near the southern limit of W 9015, mainly because the line of the pit in section below the unexcavated portion of L 9511 stops short of W 9015 at W 9015's southern limit.

Additional Observations/Value: Possible pit beneath Pig's Wall (W 9147) which cuts fallen mudbrick material.


