Summary

Opened: In excavating [F9727], came down on burnt mudbrick material; opened [L9737] below section of certain floor as test trench

Limits (N) Bounded by material below [W9704]

(S) Bordered by [F9727] and material below

(E) Bounded by E bank of A132

(W) Bordered by [L9736] and [L9727] (and material below)

Closed: End of season; Not closed

Matrix: Bright orange, mustard, burgundy, & greyish green burnt mudbrick debris some in chunks, some granular like sand, below an extremely hard yellow kurkar floor (Floor make up of F9727) and layer of brown mudbrick debris; little pottery, but what there is, is white in color

Relations: [L9727] covers [L9737]; [F9727] above [L9737] also seals [L9737]. Since [L9737] has not been completely excavated at the end of the 1991 season, further excavation is necessary to determine the relations of [L9737] to the as-of-yet unnamed loci around it. To the N, [W9704] floats above [L9737]. It appears that material from [L9737] may have been cut when building [W9704] above because the N bank of [L9737] (i.e., just below [W9704]) is composed primarily of dark brown mudbrick debris, whereas in the rest of the [L9737] the burnt mudbrick material is found right below the floor and a thin ash layer. To the W, [L9736] cuts [L9737]. The material within [L9736] does not contain evidence of destruction seen in [L9737]. To the E, [L9737] reaches the E bank of A132.

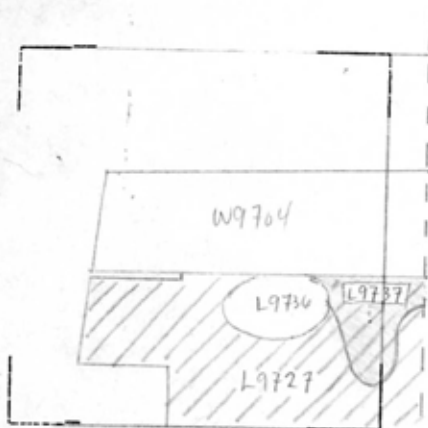
Additional Observations/Value: [L9737] definitely contains only sealed material and should therefore have a high value.
