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Summary

Opened: Opened below winter work to expose west face of W9275 and N. face of W9262

Limits (N) L9251

(S) W9262

(E) W9275

(W) L9168 and twilight zone between L9168 and L9251

Closed: When reached top of stone foundation for W9262. Changed to L9823.

Matrix: Med. brown, compact mudbrick debris. Some fragments of reed matting. Very high concentration of pottery and several bivalve shells. Several fist-sized and larger cobbles appeared to be laying up against the N. face of W9262. Similar to L9332 above and L9823 below.

Relations: [L9815] appears to be a continuation below of L9332, excavated in the 1988 season. The E. half of L9332 covers all of [L9815]. [L9815] reaches the W. face of W9275 and the N. face of W9262. To the N., [L9815] is cut by the large Persian Pit, L9251. To the SW, [L9815] was probably cut by the pit L9168, though this relationship has been obscured by erosion. To the W, [L9815] continues into the twilight zone between L9168 and L9251; this area was not included in 9815 because of its severely eroded condition and the uncertain boundary between pits L9251 and L9168.

[L9815] covers but does not reach L9823. [L9815] appears to continue below into L9823.

Additional Observations/Value: Fill reaching two mudbrick walls, W9275 and W9262 - of little stratigraphic value.
