Opened: AT BEGINNING OF SEASON AFTER REMOVAL OF WINTER WASH L9854.

Limits (N) Bounded by L9858, F9852, L9870, L9853, L9871, AND L9868.

Closed: CAME DOWN OF F9863; THEREFORE, AREA WAS SPLIT INTO 2 NEW LOCI - L9890 FOR THE CONTINUATION OF THE WESTERN PIT AND L9901 FOR FLOOR MAKE UP AND BELOW.

Matrix: THE WESTERN PIT CONSISTED PRIMARILY OF GREY ASH, SAND AND CHARCOAL FLECKS. POTTERY SHEARDS LITTERED THE ENTIRE LOCUS, AS WELL AS IRON SLAG AND BONE. F9863 1.6m x .7m, IS OF CRUSHED KURJAR W/ INCLUSIONS OF POTTERY SHEARDS. THE MTRX DIRECTLY ABOVE F9863 WAS HARDER THAN THE WESTERN PIT AND BROWN IN COLOR. SHEARDS RECOVERED IN F9863 WERE GENERAL IR / IR2c / IR / EGR / ATC / PR.

Relations: To the north, L9858 (sealed masonry) yielded iron age material and probably cuts L9863. L9863 probably cuts L9853/L9871, AS THE MATERIAL WITHIN THIS PIT IS EARLIER THAN THAT OF L9853/L9871. THE SAME REASONING AND RELATION APPLIES TO L9862, L9864 AND L9889 BELOW. L9863'S RELATIONSHIP TO L9875 IS UNCERTAIN - THEIR MATRICES ARE DIFFERENT, BUT THE MATERIAL WITHIN THEM DATE TO THE SAME GENERAL PERIOD. THEY MAY BE CONTEMPORARY PITS.

To the south, L9863 is cut by W9278 and W9425. ITS RELATIONSHIP TO THE UNNUMBERED LOCUS BETWEEN THESE TWO WALLS (L9773 IN THE 1992 SEASON) IS UNCLEAR, AS THAT AREA IS UNEXCAVATED. L9863 APPEARS TO BE A PERSIAN PIT CUTTING THROUGH A LATE IRON AGE DEPOSIT BASED ON THE COLLECTION OF SHEARDS.

F9863 IS A PARTIAL FLOOR THAT UNDULATES AND HAS POCKETS OF NON-FLOOR MATERIAL. ITS WESTERN EDGE IS NOT WELL DEFINED. UPON EXCAVATION OF L9870 (BELOW F9853) TO THE LEVEL OF F9863, IT WAS FOUND THAT F9863 DOES NOT EXTEND INTO L9870. * F9863 ALSO REACHES THE EAST BANK, THE UNNUMBERED PEDESTAL BELOW W9425 AND THE UNNUMBERED AREA THAT WAS L9773. THE WESTERN SIDE OF L9863, A PIT; CUTS F9863 ON THE WESTERN EDGE.

* AN EXPLANATION OF THIS MAY BE THAT SUCH A SMALL HEIGHT DIFFERENCE BETWEEN FLOORS 9852 AND F9863 (~7cm) COULD MEAN THAT A SMALL STEP SEPARATED THE TWO AND THAT THE FLOORS WERE CONTEMPORARY. THE NORTHERN SECTION OF F9863, HOWEVER, DID NOT SLOPE UP AND INTO F9853

Additional Observations/Value: LOW VALUE. PERSIAN PIT CUT INTO LATE IRON AGE DEPOSIT. LOTS OF GOODIES, THOUGH. ADDITIONAL PHOTOS = 100831-832
