Opened: AS FLOOR MAKEUP OF F9853 AND FILL BELOW.

Limits (N) UN-NUMBERED PEDESTAL OF W9560

(S) L9901

Closed: CAME DOWN UPON F9870. IN GENERAL, FLOOR PATCHES MERGED THROUGHOUT A633

AT THE SAME AVERAGE LEVEL.

Matrix: F9853 CONSISTED OF A THIN, FAINT LAYER OF CRUSHED KURKAR W/ POTTERY INCLUSIONS. FILL BELOW F9853 WAS MED BROWN TO GREY SOIL W/ ASH + MUDBRICK DEBRIS. DIRECTLY ABOVE F9870, SOIL WAS HARD-PACKED, DARK CHOCOLATE BROWN COLOR WITH NO INCLUSIONS AT ALL. \* THESE MATRICES DIFFER FROM THOSE SURROUNDING; TO THE W, L9871 CONSISTED OF SANDY GREY SOIL, AND TO THE E, L9901 CONSISTED OF REDDISH BROWN SOIL.

Relations: L9870 WAS COVERED, BUT NOT SEALED, BY L1F 9853; F9853 WAS TOO PATCHY TO SEAL THE MATERIAL BELOW. L9870 COULDN'T INTO THE UN-NUMBERED PEDESTAL OF W9560 AND THE E Baulk. To the W, L9890 IS CUT BY L9871; L9871 IS AN IRON AGE PIT, UNLIKE L9870 WHICH IS A FILL. ALSO, F9870 IS NOT CLEARLY DEFINED AT ITS WESTERN EDGE. RATHER, THE FLOOR IS PATCHY AND FADES INTO THE SOIL MATRIX, PROBABLY DISTURBED L1F 9853. To the south, L9901 ALSO CAME DOWN ON A FLOOR (F9901) AT THE SAME LEVEL AS F9870. BOTH FLRS & LOC. WERE PROBABLY CONTEMPORARY BECAUSE OF THEIR LEVELS AND BOTH FILLS ABOVE YIELDED IR1 AND IR2A SHARD MATERIAL, L9901 PROBABLY THEM REACHES L9901. ONLY THE FACT THAT THEIR RESPECTIVE SOIL MATRICES WERE DISTINCTLY DIFFERENT CONTRADICTS THIS HYPOTHESIS. L9870 COVERS, BUT DOES NOT SEAL, THE NORTHEASTERN SECTION OF L9932(c). ALTHOUGH F9870 COVERS & SELLS L9932(a) [SEE BELOW].

F9870 APPROACHES, BUT DOES NOT REACH, THE UN-NUMBERED PEDESTAL BELOW W9560. F9870 REACHES THE EAST Baulk AND EXTENDS THROUGHOUT THE WIDTH OF L9870 BUT ONLY HALFWAY TO THE SOUTH (30 CM LONG). UPON EXCAVATING THE VERY SOUTHERN END OF L9870, WHILE LOOKING FOR A NORTHERLY CONTINUATION OF F9901, WE ENCOUNTERED THE SAME HARD-PACKED DARK CHOCOLATE BROWN SOIL THAT WAS DIRECTLY ABOVE F9870, BUT NO FLOOR BENEATH.

\* F9870'S MATRIX WAS A WELL-PACKED, THICK CRUSHED KURKAR, WITH POTTERY INCLUSIONS. A PATCH OF GREY-WHITE RESURFACING WAS AT THE NW CORNER (SEE SKETCH). \*

F9870 APPEARS TO BE CONTEMPORARY WITH NUMEROUS OTHER FLOOR PATCHES IN THE SQUARE. IT IS THE LAST PRESERVED FLOOR AT THIS LEVEL; THEREFORE IT COVERS AND SELLS THE AREA BELOW, L9932(a).

Additional Observations/Value: HIGH VALUE IRON AGE FLOOR. MATERIAL BELOW IS SEALED.


