Opened: L9866 was closed when it came down on W9211. L9872 was opened in area S. of wall.

 (W) Persian pit L9680

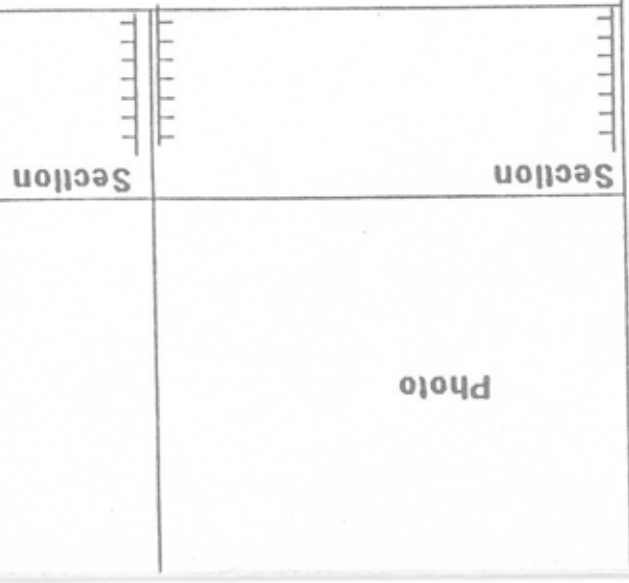
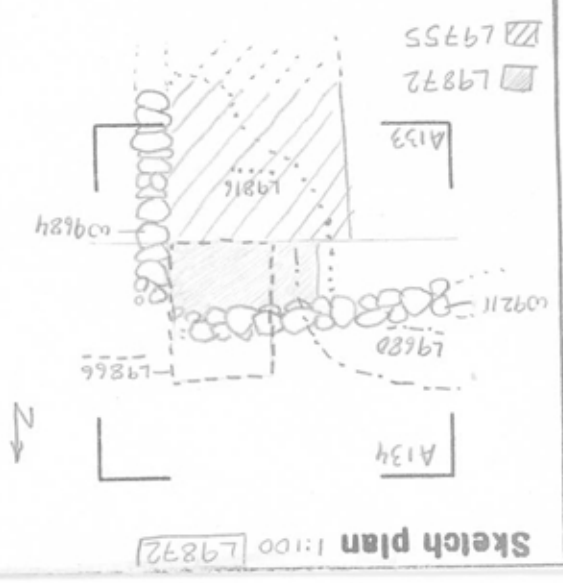
Closed: L9872 came down on the N. continuation of rubble locus L9816.

Matrix: Very dense and compact mudbrick debris, often with turkie inclusions. Thumb size fragments of charcoal throughout. Many fist-sized and smaller rocks. Very little pottery, though many (15+) flint debitage pieces. Similar to L9866 above. Matrix similar to mudbrick debris locus L9755 to Res.

Relations: The S. section of L9866 continues down into L9872.  
 To the N. L9872 reaches the S. face of W9211.  
 To the E. L9872 reaches the W. face of W9684.  
 To the W. L9872 is cut by the massive pit L9680.  
 To the S. L9872 continues into the mudbrick debris L9755.  
 L9872 covers but does not seal the rubble L9816 below.  
 Because of the uneven and sloping surface of the rubble below the lowest surface of L9872 is highly uneven.

Additional Observations/Value: Mudbrick debris covering rubble fall; low value.
